Feng Shui Tip: Bathrooms

A nasty stomach bug was running through my family this month, and it made me think about bathrooms. I find these rooms to be the most neglected spaces in too many of my clients' houses and commercial spaces. Water represents abundance in Feng Shui, but in a bathroom water is also associated with waste going down the toilet and the drain. Therefore, the location of a bathroom can have a negative effect on your wealth and abundance. If your bathroom is not balanced, you may be symbolically flushing your wealth down the drain.

Here are a few tips to balance inauspicious bathroom locations:

- If your bathroom is across from the front door or at the top of the stairs, keep the door closed and hang a mirror or colorful artwork on it to deflect the chi toward the other rooms.
- If you can see the toilet when you are in bed, keep the door closed at night to assure a restful sleep.
- If your bathroom is in the center of the house, add objects the represent either the Fire Element (such as a pair of red candles) or the Earth Element (a ceramic bowl full of river stones) to ground the space.
- If you have leaky faucets or toilets in the bathroom fix them immediately since leaking water represents leaking wealth.
- If the head of your bed backs up to a wall with a toilet on the other side, use a thickly padded headboard or hang a quilt, rug, or fiber art behind your head to protect you.

Clutter Clinic: Removing Outdated Decorations

In February, the month of romance, wives all over America are asking their husbands the same question: When are you going to take down those Christmas lights? If your holiday lights are still wrapped round your roof, your sad Santa is still sitting on your lawn, or that warped wreath is hanging on your door, you are blocking the positive energy and wealth from entering your house. Seasonal decorations connect us to the world around us, but when the holiday is over, outdated decorations represent being stuck in the past and unable to move forward. At least one country music star may have made a lot of money singing about keeping her Christmas lights on her front porch all year long, but for most of us it represents just the opposite. Replace stale decorations with bright new ones that are appropriate for the current season and usher in new wealth and abundance.

Success Story: Brenda's New Romance

Brenda is a divorced mother who wanted to start over and invite a new relationship into her life but did not know where to start making changes. I recommended she start in her hall closet and clear out the clutter that represented her ex-husband. Opening up space in a closet is a great way to make room for a new love to come into your life. Brenda began tossing things, including a box of yellowed wedding photos, a forgotten pair of her ex's old athletic shoes, and the last of his baseball caps. All of these things represented the accumulated weight of the relationship. Within a month of her closet clearing, Brenda met a wonderful man at a party and she is well on her way to starting over.

Feng Shui Q & A:

Q: My doors squeak. Does this have a Feng Shui meaning?

A: Whenever doors do not open and close smoothly and completely, they represent blocked opportunities. Squeaking doors are specifically associated with petty arguments because they represent restricted flow into your life. A squeaky front door means fighting your way through life since this door is considered the entrance for all the good energy into your home. Fix your squeaky door and you will start to fix what is not working in your life.

Q: I am trying to build teamwork among the members of the small work group that I manage within a large company. Several of the team members telecommute from different states and we only meet as a group a few times during a year. Can I use Feng Shui to keep my team connected even though they are separated by distance?

A: When your work group is separated, whether geographically or just by corridors or floors in an office building, the solution is to connect the team by using symbols. First, make sure that all of the team members have items imprinted with the company logo or in the company colors to tie them into the organization (a mug, a mouse pad, a golf shirt, etc.). Next, present each person with a gift of an object that is an icon or symbol of the goal you are working toward, such as an eagle to represent soaring toward success, and suggest that they display the object on their desk where they will see it each day.

Q: Does a tri-level house warrant any special consideration when using the bagua?

A: You use the bagua mapping chart on all levels of your home to determine which rooms, and then which furniture and objects, are located in the areas that represent the critical aspects your life. First stand at the front door holding the bagua in front of you and map that level of the house. Then go to the other levels of your house and stand with your back to the equivalent of the front door and hold the bagua in front of you and map that level. Remember to map the basement and the attic.
