Feng Shui Tip: Take Feng Shui on Vacation

There is nothing like staying at home for real comfort.

Jane Austen may have liked to stay home, but most of us look forward to a long, relaxing summer vacation away from our usual routine. If you are traveling this summer, you can still take some of the comforts of home along by following a few simple Feng Shui recommendations. Whether you are staying in a hotel, beach house, or rented condo, a little bit of Feng Shui goes a long way toward assuring a harmonious vacation:

- Before you leave, throw out all the perishable food in your refrigerator and arrange for a neighbor to take out your trash so you do not come home to spoiled food or bad smells.
- And speaking of smells, ask to see your hotel room before you agree to it; if it smells smoky, musty, or just plain bad, ask for a different one.
- Unpack as soon as you get to your destination so you can quickly settle in and make the space your own.
- Store your luggage in the closet, since suitcases under the bed represent walking away from a good night's sleep.
- Bring a memento from home with you to display, such as a family photo, so it feels more like home than a borrowed space.
- Rearrange the furniture if the arrangement feels uncomfortable, but be sure to put it back in its original place before you leave.
- Open the windows if you can to bring in positive chi.
- If the mirror is opposite the bed you will not sleep restfully; call housekeeping for an extra sheet or towel to throw over the mirror at night.
- If you can see the toilet from the bed it will drain your energy; keep the door closed at night.
- Bring a small nightlight and flashlight with you so if you get up at night you will not walk into that closed bathroom door.
- Unpack and put away your suitcases as soon as you get home; suitcases left near the front door represent tying to escape from your current life situation.

Clutter Clinic: Spring Clean Your Office

When the warmer weather puts you in the mood for some spring cleaning, remember to include your office. Clean your computer, including keyboard and monitor. Vacuum, sweep, or mop your floor. Even if you have a cleaning service, doing it yourself helps to symbolically sweep out the old energy. Bundle up your electrical cords and wires and contain them with a twist tie or those tubes made specially to control cords. Remove all the books from your shelves and dust; put back only those books you use and the manuals that are current. Trim the growth and remove the dead leaves from your office plants; if you have silk plants, dust them or replace them if they are faded. If possible, wash your windows.

Feng Shui Q & A

Q: I am a writer who appreciated your Feng Shui for Writers tip last month, but I have a follow-up question. My desk faces my office door, but my computer is on a separate table. So when I am writing at my computer my back is to the door. I face a window and see a beautiful view of trees and flowers. Am I sabotaging my writing by having my back to the door, or does the positive view balance that out?

A: You may not be sabotaging your writing by sitting with your back to the door when you are at your computer, but you are certainly working harder at it than you need to because you are not sitting in a secure position. I recommend to people who spend most of their time at their keyboard (most of us, I am afraid) that they arrange their office to face the door when facing their monitor. If it is not possible to reposition your desk, place a mirror in front of you so you can glance at it and see the door. You can either place the mirror on your desk, on the wall in front of you, or get a computer mirror that attaches to your monitor (it looks like a rear view mirror). Let me know if you are interested in a rear view computer mirror and I can get one for you.

In the News: Feng Shui and Business Success

Forbes.com: Feng Shui is on the rise among top executives, according to the Forbes Magazine website. By manipulating a physical workspace in subtle ways, Feng Shui can increase employee productivity, amplify profits by attracting more customers, cut down on office politicking and build a better corporate reputation, according to the article. For example, the article explains that entrance to a building, the main flow of human traffic into many businesses, is important, as is the location of the CEO, upper management, and key people offices.
