Feng Shui To The Rescue

Feng Shui and Pets



Pets are considered positive, yang energy in Feng Shui because they add activity to our homes, even when we are not there. For example, fish represent abundance, dogs bring active chi, turtles symbolize longevity, cats are seen as financial success. The love we put into caring for our pets also represents positive energy. But when pets dominate your life, the result can be an upset in the natural balance that is critical to good Feng Shui. Are you attracting what you want into your life? If not, take a

good look at how you have arranged your household around your pets. Here are a few suggestions for balancing the yin-yang of pets.

- · Clean up pet waste in your yard.
- Locate the litter box in the garage, basement, or bathroom, and avoid keeping a litter box in the kitchen or bedroom
- Clean the fish tank regularly since a dirty tank represents a cloudy financial future.
- Keep pet out of your bed, because when a pet sleeps between a couple it symbolically splits the relationship and deters romance. If you must have pets in your bedroom, give them their own specifically-designed beds on the floor.
- Avoid keeping pet cages near the cooking and eating spaces, since pet waste symbolically contaminates your food supply.
- Remove the ashes from deceased pets from inside your home because they represent stagnant energy.
- Train your pets to stay off your chairs and tables, and instead add a climbing tower; a strip of clear packing tape attached to the bottom edge of upholstered furniture will help deter a cat from scratching.

Quick Organizing Projects



In Feng Shui, clutter represents postponed decisions and the inability to move forward, so it's important to keep your home and office as clutter free as possible. But we're all busy, and some days you only have a few minutes to spare. When your time is limited, try these quick organizing projects that can be completed in 10 minutes or less.

1. **Find It.** If you have books all over your home collect them and return them to their proper space. Or maybe it's coffee cups, drinking glasses, or shoes. Pick just one category of items and quickly get it in order.

- 2. **Enter it.** Are there phone numbers on business cards, on scraps of paper, or in e-mails that need to be entered into your address book? Give yourself ten minutes and enter as many contacts as you can into your permanent system.
- 3. **Empty it.** Spring is the perfect time to collect and store your winter weather coats, hats, and gloves, snow shovels, and window scrapers. Make sure you go through the pockets of your winter things before you send them to the cleaners or pack them away for the season.

Ask the Feng Shui Maven

Q: I'm trying to buy a new home and found one that's almost perfect, except for the exposed beams in the bedroom over the bed. I read that's not such a good thing in Feng Shui and that I should hang bamboo flutes from the beams. I have no interest in doing that, so should I keep looking?

A: Bamboo flutes were originally used in old world Feng Shui to "cut" the beam and keep it from "weighing down" on you or splitting a couple in bed. I recommend more contemporary ways to symbolically lift the pressure, including painting or staining the beams the same color as the ceiling, aiming light up at the beams, painting clouds, stars, or a vine on the bean to simulate sleeping in nature, or using a canopy,

lightweight fabric, or swag over your bed. A ceiling fan also works, since its blades symbolically cut across the beams and lessen their weight.

Q: What Feng Shui training do you recommend for professional organizers?

A: Professional organizers already know how to deal with the biggest Feng Shui issue that most people face -- clutter. I recommend they also have a basic understanding of the "Five Power Principles of Feng Shui" and how to use these basics to help organize a home or office. These principles are Chi (energy), the Five Elements (color and shape), the Bagua (mapping a home), Yin and Yang (balance), and Continuity and Connectedness (connecting with the natural world).

Q: I'm single and want to be in a relationship. I have a favorite painting with a deep rick red background, but it shows only a single female draped in black. I don't want to move the painting from my bedroom. Is there anything I can do to complement it rather than get rid of it and still invite a relationship into my life? A: Feng Shui principles recommend that when you are trying to attract a relationship it is best to remove all art and images that show single people and replace them with images that show couples, romantic scenes, or objects in pairs. This is especially important in your bedroom and in the area of your home that occupies the Love/Relationship area. Therefore, I suggest moving the image of a single female out of your bedroom and replace it art that feels romantic and coupled.
